Assisi is a small Umbrian town in central Italy, located 19 km east of Perugia at an elevation of 400 meters. Assisi, best known as the birthplace of St. Francis of Assisi, founder of the Franciscan order, is one of the most popular tourist destinations in Italy. The nearest international airports are Perugia (Sant'Egidio), Ancona (Raffaello Sanzio) and Rome (Fiumicino and Ciampino). The Assisi railway station forms part of the Foligno-Terontola railway, which links Florence, Rome and Ancona. By car there are highways from Rome, Florence and Bologna (E45).
