Invitation

On behalf of the German Branch of WPSA, we are pleased to invite you to the XIVth European Symposium on the Quality of Eggs and Egg Products and to the XXth European Symposium on the Quality of Poultry Meat in Leipzig, Germany. The conference will take place on 4-8 September, 2011 and will give an insight in recent scientific findings in the fields of egg and poultry meat quality and processing.

This will be the third time in the history of Working Groups 4 (Egg Quality) and 5 (Poultry Meat Quality) of the European Federation of WPSA to hold their Symposia in Germany, following Grub in 1981 and Hohenheim in 1989. The objectives of the Egg and Poultry Meat Symposia in 2011 will be to provide a general overview on the current state of research in the fields of egg and poultry meat quality conducted all over the World.

We look forward to welcoming you to Leipzig for an outstanding scientific program and an opportunity to sample the cultural sights in the beautiful scenery of Saxonia.

Leipzig looks back on a 1400 years history and is located in the Leipziger lowlands in the northwestern part of Saxonia, about 200 km in the south of Berlin and 100 km in the north-west of Dresden. Since about 600 years Leipzig is well known as a Book City and for its annual International Book Fair. Besides, Leipzig has been the home of many famous Germans like Nobel price winner Heisenberg, composers like Johann Sebastian Bach, Robert Schumann, Richard Wagner, and writers like Ephraim Lessing and Johann Wolfgang von Goethe. The University of Leipzig was founded in 1409.

Leipzig has the biggest collection of Wilhelminian style buildings in Germany and is famous for classical music. Here, the Gewandhaus choir and the Thomaner choir are well known World wide. The opera of Leipzig is the third oldest music theatre stage in Europe. Furthermore, Leipzig was the starting point of the peaceful revolution 1989 which ended in the decline of the German Democratic Republic and in the reunion of Germany.

Today Leipzig has more than a half million inhabitants and is as well a strong industry location. In 1996 the new Leipziger fair ground was founded which is located in the North of Leipzig. The Congress Centre Leipzig (CCL) is located on this fairground and will be the venue for the Symposia.
