INTRODUCTION

The International Mycobacterium bovis Conference has moved to Cardiff for 2014 on its four yearly cycle around the globe. This, the sixth conference, builds directly on the success of the 2009 M bovis V Conference in Wellington, New Zealand, and addresses the wide-ranging themes associated with bovine TB control throughout the world. The scientific programme has been ably led by Professor Glyn Hewinson who has taken his summary address from the Wellington Conference as the starting point for the Scientific Committee which includes renowned scientists in the field.

The antipodean feel of the last Conference was influenced by the success stories of local control programmes identifying pointers for policy development and further research required in attempting to deliver similar successes in other countries. This Conference provides the contrasting backdrop of increasing bTB prevalence in British cattle herds where there is a need to apply the outputs of such research in the formulation of policies that must lead to practical, deliverable programmes.

Wales provides the venue for this Conference, recognising the Welsh Government's innovative efforts in tackling the disease. Whereas Scotland has been granted official bTB freedom, much of the South and West of England has similar problems to Wales but these are being addressed in subtly different ways. The variance in approach of these two intimately associated countries provides opportunities to learn from each other leading fortuitously to the development of an exciting new theme to be added to the Conference this year addressing the practical delivery of control programmes which will be of particular interest to day delegates.

The opening session is one not to be missed. It includes speakers and invited guests from the major global animal and human health organisations with updates on the excellent progress being made in New Zealand and Australia. The core of the Conference rightly remains a strong scientific programme. Plenary speakers, all international experts in their field, are supported by programme sessions including epidemiology, vaccination, social science and economics, diagnostics, innovations, wildlife topics, policy options and practical delivery issues. A social programme drawing upon the delights of Cardiff City Hall and Cardiff Museum provides a chance to relax in the company of fellow delegates.

This is an exciting programme offering something for everyone with an interest in bTB. It maintains the original values of the M bovis Conference that have seen it grow into the globally significant event it has now become.
